In-Text Citations (MLA)

If you need help with the in-text citation for any source, see a Librarian.

The MLA guidelines require that you cite quotations, summaries, paraphrases, and other material used from sources within parentheses placed at the end of the sentence in which the quoted or paraphrased material appears. These in-text parenthetical citations correspond to the Works Cited page found at the end of your paper. On-line sources follow the same pattern as print versions.
