


PROJECT #2- Depth of Field


Required Objectives:

For this assignment, you will be required to capture a setting that tells a story with a beginning, a middle and an end (story telling compositions). You will be required to use the same composition and also complete a few different single theme apertures. An example might be taking a photograph of a long dirt road in the woods with vibrant colored leaves on the path which emphasizes the concept of depth of field. Then taking a few shots of the leaves as the main subject of the composition. Or taking a photograph of an old barn in a field, and then taking a few shots of the old windows in the barn or the peeling paint on the wood or some flowers in the field. After the images are chosen you will create a final layout that incorporates all of the final photographs. (An example will be provided in class.

- You can create 4" * 6" images, or 8" * 10".
- You must have at least three final images in your final project.
- You can have the images be in color or in black and white.
